Medical treatment and care

Specialist medical and nursing staff provide comprehensive HIV prevention and treatment, and sexual health and hepatitis care. Access to antiretroviral treatment for all clients living with HIV, HIV care in pregnancy, PEP and PrEP prevention, and STI treatments are provided. As Albion is **not** a General Practice a indefinite referral from a GP for ongoing HIV care is desirable.

HIV and sexual health screening

At Albion part of your management is attending routine HIV blood tests every 4-6 months.
