

Mention the mouth! Oral health.

Should you? Would you? Could you? Learn how to add a mention of the mouth to help save a smile.

29 April to 26 May 2024

A four-week facilitated online course for non-dental professionals providing practical advice to reduce oral health related issues for clients at higher risk of damage to their teeth.

Topics covered include:

- Recognising oral health risks
- Nutrition, oral health and links to HIV, other blood borne viruses, alcohol and drug use
- Practical advice for immediate relief and prevention of oral health issues
- Screening tools and referral pathways for treatment

Who should attend? Nurses, GPs, allied health, welfare, community, or health promotion workers with clients vulnerable and at higher risk for oral health issues (including those with blood borne viruses, polypharmacy, illicit drug and alcohol use).

Requirements: Participants will need an email address and access to the internet and will be expected to spend approximately 3 hours per week for 4 weeks to complete the course. The course is counted as 1.5 days (or 12 hours) of study. There will be no set time to be on-line. Participants can complete activities each week at a time that suits them.
