

Sexual Health History Taking for Nurses

5 February to 17 March 2024

A six-week interactive, facilitated online course that examines current epidemiological and sociological rationales for taking a sexual health history taking.

Topics covered include:

- Epidemiology
- Communication
- Testing and Risk Assessment
- Interview Skills
- Australian Contexts
- Professional Development

Who should attend? Registered and enrolled nurses working in general practice or new to the sexual health sector.

Requirements:

Participants will need an email address and access to the internet. Capacity to undertake a minimum of 3 hours study per week over 6 weeks. There is no set time to be online, but participants are expected to log in each week and contribute to discussion fora. This course is counted as 18 hours of continuous professional development.

Learning Outcomes:

- Modify a communication style and establish a rapport, where appropriate, to accommodate differences in comprehension due to age, culture, language, health condition, disability and wellbeing
- Articulate how the geographic, cultural and socio-economic characteristics of a local community may impact on the health of individuals
- Integrate knowledge of current trends in sexual health in Australia to obtain informed consent and routine testing for at risk clients
- Apply a person-centred approach to sexual health history taking; including screening and managing risk practice
- Demonstrate ability to initiate discussion about STI and BBV prevention, transmission, implications of results and contact tracing requirements
- Identify how to incorporate sexual health history taking into own practice
- Identify referral pathways to health practitioners and service
- Articulate a working knowledge of laws relating to sexual health, own scope of practice and compliance with nursing standards, guidelines, legislation and regulations
- Appraise own nursing practice and seek opportunities for professional development
